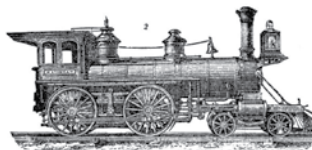

We have one more function and that will be the Fathers Day Breakfast. Please try and attend.

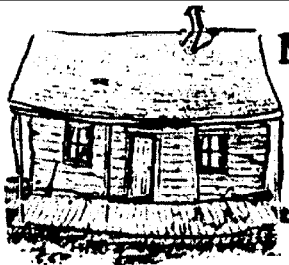

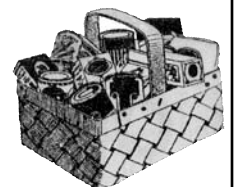
