



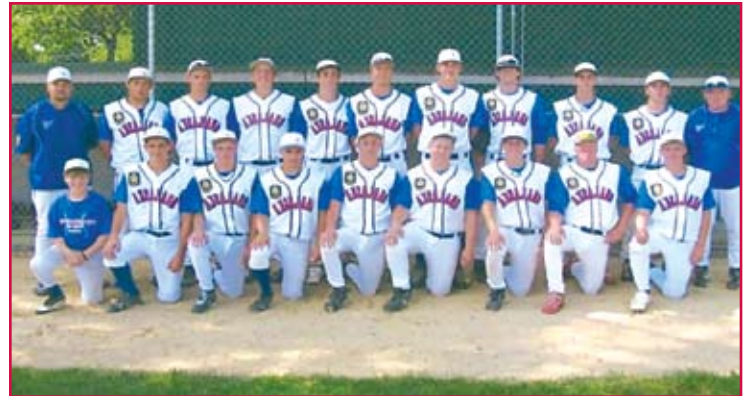

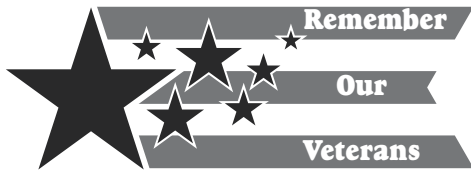

# Veterans Outreach

Hope July was great for you all! If you are a Brewers or a Twins fan you are probably “pulling you hair out”. Be careful! As we veterans get a little older the head gets a “little balder”.

Federal & State GI Education Bill. A couple of interesting changes to the Wisconsin and Federal GI Bills. The State of Wisconsin provides a number of educational programs for state veterans that are in addition to any federal veterans’ educational benefits that may be available. Eligibility varies between programs, including state residency requirements.

The Wisconsin G. I. Bill provides a full waiver (“remission”) of tuition and fees for eligible veterans and their dependents. It covers up to 8 full-time semesters of 128 credits at any University of Wisconsin System (UWS) or Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) institution for continuing education, or for study at the undergraduate or graduate level. In accordance with 2005 Wisconsin Act 468 signed into law by Governor Jim Doyle on Memorial Day 2006 and effective with the 2007-08 academic year, the tuition remission is full 100% of tuition and fees. Now maybe you are saying I was in service during the Vietnam period and used my Federal GI bill back then. Well, you now can go back and get some more education under this bill.

For the Wisconsin G. I. Bill, the veteran must have been a Wisconsin resident at the time of entry onto active duty. Veterans’ character of service and active duty requirements applies. The benefit recipient must reside in Wisconsin. For veterans there is no post-service time limitation on the use of the benefit. The Wisconsin veteran may attend full-time or part-time. The benefit may be used for continuing education, or for study at the undergraduate or graduate level. This is a great Wisconsin veteran benefit. If you are interested “in going back to school” contact La Crosse County Veterans Service Officer Jim Gausmann at (608) 785-9719.

The U.S. Senate Veterans’ Affairs Committee has proposed S. 3447; a bill aimed at improving the new Federal G. I. Bill. If the bill passes the new legislation would:

- Count all Reserve and National Guard activation’s toward eligibility for education benefits
- Cover the cost of all education at any public university, including masters programs and PHD programs.
- Include coverage for vocational programs, OJT and apprenticeship training and other types of non-degree education and training, in addition to a university education.

These education changes will improve the existing Federal G. I. Benefits. Feel free to check it out.

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. In July, the VA officially unveiled changes in its rules on post-traumatic stress disorder claims, easing the standards for proof for veterans claiming to have experienced a traumatic event. Any veteran may qualify for help with PTSD. This is important. This change makes it much easier to put the necessary paperwork in process and getting help for PTSD. This change by the VA will no longer require veterans to relive their nightmares in great detail and is a positive step forward for veterans of all generations. 
