This is the time I had hoped would not come, however it has arrived. On Friday, 13 May 2011 at 2:20PM my bride passed away and is now in the arms of our Lord. The last few months saw a steady decline in her condition. During the night of Tuesday, 10 May she awoke to a number of issues. This continued thru Wednesday and we thought that she would not make it to Thursday. Being the fighter she was, she did not give up until early afternoon on Friday. Her breathing was very labored, she opened her eyes only briefly, all body functions had seemed to slow down. Her pulse was extremely low as indicated by her breathing, which now had long periods of time between each breath. Sometime a little after 2:00PM on Friday, she seemed to be trying to tell us something. She would try to raise her left hand as best she could which we thought was her request to hold our hand. We eventually realized she was waving. We asked her if this was a wave and she gave us a labored "thumbs-up". She continued to wave and give the "thumbs-up" for a number of minutes. We finally realized she was saying goodbye and that it was all right and she knew her time had come. My 3 children, Mindy, Kristen, Jimmy, our hospice nurse Sandy and I were at her bedside most of the day. We watched as the pause between each breath became longer and longer. She was breathing with her mouth open as oxygen no longer helped. When her eyes were open, she could no longer focus. We had turned off her abdominal feeding tube and removed her catheter on Thursday. She began receiving morphine on Thursday also. My bride had previously decided that she did not want to return to the hospital ever again. She previously made the decision that she did not want to be resuscitated (DNR), to which she persuaded us to agree. This was in her living will. Her visitation on Monday evening, 13 May was attended by more than 600 friends and relatives. The funeral was attended on Tuesday by approximately 100. This was a true testimonial to the special person that she was. Our hearts are broken, we celebrate her life, we will endure and the memories will be with us forever. This horrible journey has taken over 3 years. It was a "no hope" trek but my bride still maintained her positive attitude, big smile and love in her heart and eyes. She will truly be missed.

I wish to thank all who offered their condolences, sympathies, support, memorials, flowers and most of all their friendship. The flower arrangement from the Post was absolutely beautiful. I have used this newsletter to chronicle my bride's disease. It has now ended. I hope I have not offended anyone. In the event I have, I truly apologize.

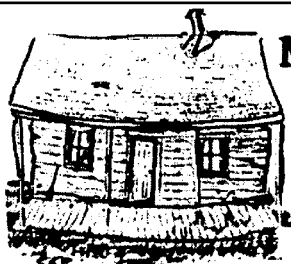


Ladies remember the Freedom Honor Flight fund raiser on June 11<sup>th</sup>. Let's all help raise funds for this cause.

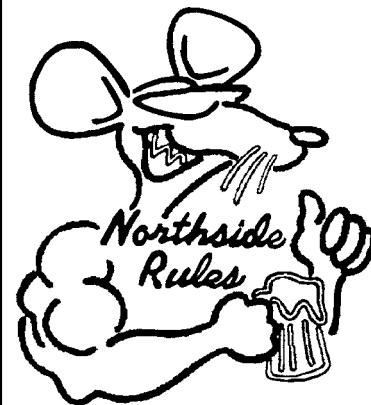

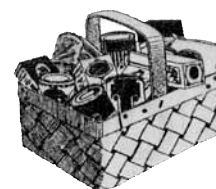
